Why do you want to become an ASAF Board member?

Joining the ASAF board entails taking on leadership responsibilities to assist community from various backgrounds and disciplines. What is your vision for ASAF?

In the first year of my service to ASAF, I will concentrate on developing methods to make ASAF more participatory and helpful in terms of experience sharing and

maximizing opportunities. I intend to work toward transparency with well-established worldwide collaborative forums. ASAF will host more annual forums, including a scientist's forum, an EU-AUC forum, general forums, and further regional and national forums. This will serve to increase ASAF's influence, and members will be able to engage in many regional and global events. I will collaborate closely with ASAF members, service providers, AUCs, and the EU to ensure that ASAF is more effective and autonomous. By 2026, ASAF will be one of the continent's largest forums, with over 500 members gathering onsite to discuss Africa's future prospects.

I have been participated in the Membership Promotion and Activation Task Force, sharing my experiences, and I gave numerous presentations to members about scholarship opportunities and application procedures.
